We are a university centre founded in 1981 in Terrassa dedicated to training professionals and leadership teams to enhance the business environment. Residence and NIE

If you are a student whose nationality is outside the European Union, you must apply for the appropriate study visa to come to Spain. This can be processed at the Spanish embassy or consulate in your country and usually takes at least three months to complete.

If your stay in Spain exceeds six months and you have entered the country with a study visa, you will need to obtain a Foreign Identity Card (TIE), which acts as an extension of your visa.


To do this, you must register your residency, a process known as "empadronamiento", which involves enrolling in the municipal census of the city where you live to officially declare your residence there.

Whether you have only processed a visa or have a TIE, you will be issued a Foreigner Identity Number (NIE), which is unique and personal. The NIE allows you to carry out processes such as opening a bank account.

LEGALISING ACADEMIC DOCUMENTS

Original academic documents must be legalised through the UPC. The procedure depends on the type of document, the type of studies (whether they are official or not), the issuing institution and whether the documents to be legalised are Spanish or foreign documents that need to be valid in Spain.

Health insurance and healthcare



INTERNATIONAL INSURANCE

When applying for a study visa, students whose nationality is outside the European Union are required to take out private health insurance. Once in Spain, and depending on the duration of the insurance policy from your home country, you may need to renew it or take out another private health insurance policy that guarantees medical assistance throughout your stay in Spain. Some countries have agreements with the Spanish Social Security system, allowing free healthcare access at primary care centres (CAP) and hospitals under the Catalan Health Institute (ICS).



PHARMACIES

If you need to visit a pharmacy during your stay, they are easily identifiable by a green illuminated cross. If you need a pharmacy outside normal hours, a list of on-duty pharmacies will be displayed on the exterior doors of closed ones. Most medications are available only with a prescription.



HOSPITALS

Catalonia has an extensive network of health centres and hospitals. The public healthcare system offers universal and free access while ensuring high-quality care.

- Primary Care Centres (CAP): these are the first places to visit for health concerns. To access their services for free, you must hold a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC).
- Public hospitals: reserved for emergencies. If you experience a health problem, visit your CAP first and its healthcare professionals will refer you to a hospital if necessary. An EHIC is also required to access these services.
- Private medical centres: if you have private health insurance, check which hospitals or clinics are covered by your policy.



Transport

In Catalonia, there are two Alongside the railway, it is the highest-capacity public transport system, and it is only available in Barcelona.



Tram

Although trams are commonly used in Europe, they are only implemented in two Catalan counties: Baix Llobregat and Barcelonès (where Barcelona is located). There are no trams in Terrassa.



Bus

The bus network includes urban services operating within municipalities and intercity services connecting towns across Catalonia. Highlights include the NitBus, a night service covering much of Barcelona and its surroundings, and a direct line between Terrassa and the airport.



Bicycle

More people are choosing Taxis are available in all cities due to their eco-friendliness colours, such as yellow and and time efficiency. Accommodation



HALLS OF RESIDENCE

One of the options available to you is living in a hall of residence, where you will meet people from all around the world. You can rent a private room, or if you prefer, share it with another student. These halls offer many services, such as a cafeteria, laundry facilities, and more. They also provide common areas where you can enjoy leisure time and work alongside other students.

If this is your choice, you can explore the accommodation options offered by our partner halls of residence.



FLAT SHARING

University students often share flats. This type of accommodation allows you to save money as it is more affordable and helps you meet new people and live with those from different cultures. Additionally, this housing option is more flexible in case you need to change residence.

You can also explore the programme, a solidarity initiative by the Roure Foundation, where students share accommodation with an elderly person who offers a room in exchange for companionship and agreed-upon assistance, without financial transactions. This is a mutual aid social programme lasting at least one academic year.

Banking

While living in Spain, having a bank account is very useful for securely managing your expenses and income (e.g. paying rent, applying for a scholarship, or receiving money from your home country) and for withdrawing cash from ATMs available 24/7.

We also recommend consulting your bank before leaving your country to inquire about foreign transaction fees and conditions for transferring money.



TO OPEN A BANK ACCOUNT

- > If you are a resident, presenting your NIE to the bank or financial institution will be enough.
- > If you are not a resident, you must first obtain a non-resident certificate. To do this, visit your consulate or any National Police office in Spain with your passport to request the certificate (this process typically takes around 10–12 days).



REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

- > A valid and unexpired passport or national ID (for EU citizens).
- > Proof of address, such as a recent bank statement or a utility bill (issued within the last three months).
- > A document verifying your current employment status, such as a payslip, a tax return, or a government letter confirming unemployment or receipt of unemployment benefits.

Mobile phones and Internet

Upon your arrival in Spain, having a mobile phone with a Spanish number is also convenient for administrative tasks.

✓ PREPAID SIM CARD

You can purchase a prepaid SIM card online, at physical operator stores, kiosks, and other points of sale.

✓ CONTRACT

To sign up for a telephone line or Internet contract, you can use the same operators that offer the service and it will be necessary to provide an account number. You may also find promotional packages combining phone and Internet services with flat-rate plans, though these often require a minimum contract period (typically at least one year).

Several companies operate in Spain, allowing you to contract the services you need. Common providers include Movistar, Vodafone, Orange, and Jazztel.



International student support

For queries related to your stay, you should contact the university's international office, which can assist you with:

- > Registering as an international student.
- > Information about social and orientation activities for students.
- > Any non-academic questions that may arise during your stay.
